Miss his eye, and you'll be out of balance. It has been forbidden to close your eyes even when the rival's sword plunges into you. Keep staring at his eye until the last moment of life. Seeing in Kendo is divided into two, seeing a part and seeing the whole. One more thing about the eye. One has to train to be able to see through the chest so one can recognize a mole in the back. So taught the Buddha.
