At the November 1 meeting, the Board also voted to add Shinichi Koike (Northwest) and Manabu Yabe (Seattle) to the Board of Directors for 1998/1999, bringing the total to Jeffrey Marsten (Bellevue/Highline) and Kiyoshi Yasui (Seattle) continue fourteen. as PNKF Advisors.

US TEAM TO 11th WORLD KENDO CHAMPIONSHIPS FIRST ELIMINATIONS. tryouts for the AUSKF Team to the 11WKC will be in Los Angeles tentatively in mid-Exact time and place to be announced by formal communication. The first tryout will select 20 men and 20 women. There will be a one-time entry fee of \$40 that covers both the first and second tryout. The second elimination will reduce the candidates from 20 to 9 + 1 wild card. If the winner of the AUSKF Tournament in August is not one of the 9 and is eligible for the team they would get the 10th position. If the winner is in eligible or already on the team the wild card will get the 10th position. The location of the 2nd elimination will be determined by the composition of the candidates.
