### PASSAGE

The PNKF extends sympathy to the family in the loss of our dear friend and supporter Nakakura Kiyoshi, Kendo and Iaido Hanshi 9th Dan, who passed away on February 9, 2000. Many PNKF members were privileged to meet and keiko with Nakakura Sensei when he and his lovely wife Masa visited the greater Seattle area July 2 and 3, 1991 for a stay at the home of their personal friends, Curtis and Vicki Marsten. Nakakura Sensei was born in 1910 in Kagoshima Prefecture. A leading student of the great Nakayama Hakudo, Nakakura Sensei along with Haga Junichi was one of the famous "Sambaragasu" ("Three Black Crows"). We had the honor of sitting in the Marsten home while hearing Nakakura Sensei discuss the old days with Haga Junichi's younger brother our own good friend and frequent visitor Haga Tadatoshi.

As well as being perhaps the top-rated kenshi in the world, Nakakura Sensei was also eminent in the history of modern Aikido, having been designated for a period the successor and heir-apparent to the founder Ueshiba Morihei, during which time he assumed the name Ueshiba and was married to Ueshiba Sensei's daughter.

Nakakura Sensei was the guest of honor at the 5th US Championships held in September 1990 at Fort Worth, Texas, at which time and place the PNKF's own Koike Shinichi performed an incredible mohangeiko with Nakakura Sensei.
