PNKF 2014 Iaido Tournament Divisions and Rules

The seventh annual PNKF Iaido Tournament will be held the morning of Sunday September 28^h, 2014; coinciding with the PNKF Annual Iaido seminar. There will be three individual divisions, Mudansha (Ikkyu and below), Shodan to Nidan and Sandan to Yondan, in addition to a team competition described below.

The individual divisions will consist of a single elimination bracket where competitors will perform 5 predefined kata from the set of 12 All Japan Kendo Federation iaido kata. The 5 kata must be performed within a time limit of 6 minutes, and a winner will be determined by hantei. The Sandan and Yondan division will perform 2 Koryu kata of their choosing and 3 predefined kata from the All Japan Kendo Federation Iaido kata in the same time limit.

The team competition will consist of 3-person dojo teams competing in a single elimination bracket with the 3-person team that has the most points advancing to the next round. Each dojo team should consist of 3 individuals meeting the following requirements

- 1 Ikkyu or below member
- 1 Shodan or Nidan member
- 1 Sandan or Yondan member

If a dojo does not have a member of a specified rank, a member with lower rank may be substituted instead. All team members must be registered for the tournament in the individual's bracket.

Each team match will consist of the 3 individual matches with the lowest ranking pair competing first and the highest-ranking pair competing last. Each individual match victory will result in a point for the team and the team with the most points at the end of the team match will advance to the next round.

The tournament and matches will be conducted using the rules and procedures of the All Japan Kendo Federation "Regulation of Iaido Shiai and Shinpan", revised October 1, 1996; except where modified to meet the needs of the venue and competitors by the Tournament Director and Shinpan Cho. The Tournament Director will have final say in determining all decisions regarding matters of entries and eligibility. During competition all matters of judging and competition will be decided and directed by the Shinpan Cho.

Dojo representatives should submit rosters to Brian Blomquist (the tournament director) by the afternoon of Saturday September 27th. If time and space permit, we will allow up to two teams per dojo. Teams must contain at least 2 members from the representing dojo.
