THE LAST WORD When it comes to matches, few people can display any more strength than they do during normal keiko. In fact, some people produce even less than their usual strength, owing to nervousness. Thus, it is important that you perform ordinary keiko properly, so that you will not become easily flustered in competition. This means constantly training to be the first to execute a valid strike, with no unnecessary or futile movements. It also means always being responsive to your opponent's movements. Your keiko should therefore be conducted at a high pitch of alertness. --Ozawa Hiroshi, KENDO: THE DEFINITIVE GUIDE.
