

HOKUBEI KENDO TAIKAN WILL APPEAR IN 2001

More details will be coming soon regarding an incredibly rare major historical document in the history of US Kendo which came out just before World War II and is now being reprinted by a publisher specializing in recovery of rare books. The book is Hokubei Kendo Taikan, written by Ikken Momii, and published in San Francisco by Hokubei Butoku Kai in 1939. This book is essentially a copiously illustrated history and directory of the majority of Kendo activity and most of the important Kendo personages in every town on the West Coast.
