PNKF TEAM OUTSTANDING AT US CHAMPIONSHIPS

Pacific Northwest Kendo Federation (Lonny Hancock, Bryan Imanishi, Jeff Marsten, and Garrett Suzaka) won the Senior Youth Team Championship (16-18 years old) July 6 in Los Angeles at the 9th United States Kendo Championships. Jeff Lundell placed 2nd in Junior Youth Individual (15 years and younger), Elizabeth Marsten was 3rd in Women's individual, losing to the champion in the semi-final after a 15 + minute encho. Garrett Suzaka placed 3rd in the Senior Youth Individual and Lonny Hancock and Jeff Marsten both finished in the tie for 4th with Lonny receiving Kantosho. Curtis Marsten won the Goodwill with a very strong performance. PNKF is the first non-California team to ever win a team championship since the tournament started in 1978. The overall performance of the team was great with 17 out of 20 members making it out of the round robin into the tournament round of the individuals and 3 of the 4 teams making it out of the round robin into the tournament round in the team event.
