ARTICLE ON OMOTO SENSEI IN NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER KENDO NIPPON

A brief account of a very remarkable life lived in Kendo appears in the December and November 2004 issues of Kendo Nippon Monthly. Written by Tom Bolling, and translated into Japanese by our dear friend from Kamei Dojo, Kanazawa Mamoru Sensei, it conveys the inspired story and profound philosophy of Rod Nobuto Omoto, head instructor of Tacoma Kendo and Iaido Club, and founding charter President of the PNKF (then called the WSKF). Born in Hawai'i, Omoto Sensei studied Kendo under Ogawa Kinnosuke and other eminent teachers at Busen, the martial arts professional technical university in Kyoto. Since the 1950's, he continues to encourage the development of Kendo and the lives of countless kenshi.

Ono Kiyoshi, Kendo Kyoshi 7th Dan, passed away in Ville St-Laurent, on October 14, 2004, aged eighty-six years, with services October 17. Ono Sensei, along with Funamoto Sensei, introduced Kendo to Montreal in the late 1960's. Ono Sensei officially retired from teaching Kendo at the Montreal Kendo Club in August 2003. Ono Sensei was also honored by the Prime Minister, the Governor General, the Premier of Quebec, and the Mayor of Montreal, in tribute to his 70 year Kendo career.
