### THE LAST WORD

I believe that a strike in Kendo consists of the three types of ki. The first is the ki in kihon(fundamentals). This refers to your kamae, footwork, and movements such as suburi. It also includes your objectives and basic mindset in Kendo training. The second ki concerns striking opportunities. No matter how strong your *kamae* looks, if you make irrational attacks or strikes when a true opportunity is not available, then it will never be a valid strike. The third *ki* is related to your vigour and energy. This does not just mean loud kiai and vocalisations but your inner explosive energy. When you see an opportunity you have to be able to burst forth instantaneously to make the cut without hesitation. I do not consider it to be a true strike if one of these three types of ki is missing in the attack. The level of any kendoka can be assessed just by looking at one strike and whether or not these elements are present. --Okushima Yoshio, "The Three Ki's," Hanshi Says, Kendo World 4.3, 2008, p. 12/13.
