PASSAGE

On March 4, Kendo Kyoshi 7th Dan and laido 6th Dan Gordon Warner passed away at age 97. Born October 24, 1912 in Pasadena, California, Warner Sensei was known to all kenshi for two books, This is Kendo: the Art of Japanese Fencing (co-authored with Junzo Sasamori) and Japanese Swordsmanship: Technique and Practice (co-authored with Donn Draeger), famously having lost his left leg at the battle of Bougainville during World War II.

On March 7, Kendo and Iaido Hanshi 8th Dan Haga Tadatoshi passed away at age 92. Born in Hiroshima Prefecture March 26, 1917, he moved to Shizuoka prefecture in 1946. He visited here every summer for many years, and was greatly beloved by many students of Kendo and Iaido in North America.
